

Meeting called to order at 6:40 pm

Despite this very difficult year due to the pandemic, and the uncertainty of our future, I have been heartened by how we have all been encouraging each other and building each other up! Prayer: God, please continue to help us encourage and build each other up. Guide us into the future you have prepared for us. Help us to discern the path You have put in front of us and encourage us as we walk it. Amen.

Minutes for October were reviewed and accepted.

#### **Deacon's Report - Jerry Gray**

- Continued prayers for Craig Croxall who is back home and doing better. Continued prayers for Charles Shorter. Barbara T's daughter, Kara, is doing better – prayers for her continued healing. Prayers for Jerry Gray who has a cough and for Edie who is improving after a leg muscle strain.
- Indoor & online services are being done and still working out the kinks. Thank you to Maddy O'Connor who did a great job recording yesterday's service!
- Thanksgiving Sunday is this coming Sunday, 11/22. Cornucopia will be put out and the food wagon will be blessed. Susan will deliver to town hall on Monday.
- November 29<sup>th</sup> is the first Sunday in Advent. Will be serving communion factory prepackaged juice/cracker with separate seals will be placed on tables for people to pick up as they come in either entrance. Advent wreath will be out and first candle lit. Will advertise on Facebook and YouTube for people at home to get their own bread & juice to join us. An e-mail will also be sent out to everyone.
- December 6<sup>th</sup> is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Advent and our Hanging of the Greens service. Will attach bows and hang wreathes on Saturday, December 5<sup>th</sup>. We need readers. Jerry B. will play a verse of each hymn that we usually sing between readings. No singing.
- Order forms for wreathes and poinsettias will be in Elmwords and Sunday bulletins.
   There is money in the flower fund to buy wreathes that are not donated. Mitten Tree will be set up and there will be a pink poinsettia, and in memory of Bobbie, Mason & Christine Ellison, and a red one as well.
- December 13<sup>th</sup> is the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Advent.
- December 20<sup>th</sup> is Christmas Sunday. There will be no trumpeter and no singing. No soloists. Church will be decorated with poinsettias. Christ child will be brought up this service because there will be no Christmas Eve candlelight service this year.

- Usual ads we place in West Hartford and Newington Life papers will not be run.
- Finally got in contact with California regarding our new website. They have done some
  work on it as there is now a calendar page through Google calendar like what we have in
  Elmwords. Still need a couple of more things done before we can publish it. There will
  be a sign-up for people to come to services so we can keep track of numbers and keep
  everyone safely spaced.

- We invite everyone after service 11/29 to safely make Christmas cards for the homebound.

#### **Missions - Cindy Gauthier**

- Will be preparing and delivering dinner to South Park Inn on November 22<sup>nd</sup>. Cindy's friends, Victoria & Matt Bragg will be doing it for the first time along with Cindy. We will be preparing Shepard's Pie Thanksgiving style with turkey instead of hamburg and homemade cranberry sauce. Their daughter Peyton and Haley Gauthier will be peeling the potatoes. Ernestine Nobou, Jerry & Edie Gray and Wendy Leonard and Daysha Haxton will be making sandwiches. Susan will be providing the cookies.
- Cindy contacted South Park Inn for dates for 2021 but they don't have the calendar available yet. She will call again.
- Gail O'Connor has about 50 soap sacks w/soap to be dropped off at South Park.
- Susan has gotten no response from Astrid Lundgren at the Town of West Hartford Social Services re whether they are collecting mittens, etc. or doing Adopt-a-Family this year.
   Will keep trying.

#### Trustees - Bill Alberti

- Took \$10,000 out of the Endowment Fund in September and \$15,000 in October to meet expenses. Fund is now at \$170,000.
- Fresh Start sent back their new lease at \$400 a month but we are holding back returning it for now until we hear back from Grace Church.
- Parsonage has been completely painted by Judy Williams and her sister and it looks great! Layne Brown and Mark Janas replaced the rotted porch beam and also the upstairs bathroom ceiling. Mark is repairing the downstairs bathroom toilet. Thank you to Susan Wiley for the new garage door. Thank you to Cindy Gauthier for the new kitchen cabinet handles. Thank you to Judy Williams for painting the interior stairs and spindles in the parsonage as a donation to the church. Cindy Gauthier and Judy Williams will be doing the deep cleaning on the parsonage house on 11/17.
- Asked Judy Williams to paint the front stoop posts and latticework. She quoted \$250 plus cost of paint.

- Cindy will contact West Hartford Lock about replacing the deadbolt on the door from the living room onto the porch as we cannot find a key for it.
- Susan Wiley will send Bill the paperwork to sign to rent the parsonage for 12/1. All applications will be reviewed by Bill, Chuck and Dave Lamb.
- Dave Lamb will contact B&M Tree Service to remove tree in front southeast corner of property. \$800.
- There is still a refrigerator and freezer that need to come out of the basement.
- Journey Home came and took two bureaus out of the garage. Petersons will take the kitchen table. Tall bureau, bed frame and treadmill will be put on the street when no rain in the forecast. Various church grills need to be moved to the utility shed.
- Still receiving weekly complaints from renters regarding cleanliness of facility. Hiring Judy Williams to do the cleaning of the church building starting this week.
- Chuck is looking into different snow plowing services. Person we have been using is very good (came out and salted immediately on last storm) but also very expensive.

#### Controller's Report – Susan Wiley

- Financial Summary 2020 through September passed out. As for withdrawing funds from the Barnum Fund, we are better off than last year. Pastor Dave was still on payroll in September so YTD deficit at -\$20,844.
- No income from activities this year as no activities.
- YTD income \$88,682 vs expenses \$109,526.
- Will see what October numbers are without salary, benefits and other expenses of a full-time pastor.

#### Member at Large - Wendy Leonard/Daysha Haxton - Not present, no report

#### Old Business -

• Stewardship as of Friday, 11/13/20 – We are still about \$10,000 out for 2020 pledges. For 2021 there are 16 pledges in so far for a total of \$20,000. There are still 18 who pledged for 2020 who have not pledged for 2021. Of the 16 current pledges there is 1 new one, 2 increases, 12 staying the same and 1 decrease. Thank you to those who have pledged. Continuing to ask for pledges on Sundays.

#### New Business -

- Annual meeting after discussions regarding how to possibly have one in light of the current pandemic, and in light of all the questions we are waiting on answers, it was decided to postpone the Annual Meeting until the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2021. Further information will be provided in March.
- We are in discussions with Grace Church regarding renting our building. They gave us
  days, times and rooms needed. Trustees gave them a monthly rent figure. They were
  meeting this week to discuss. Council asked Cindy to let Dave Clymer know that we are
  flexible and want to make this arrangement with them work.

#### SOAP SACKS

Hello Church Friends,

I am looking for some help from any of our friends who knit or crochet. I would like to send some Soap Sacks with the Missions Committee the next time they send a meal to South Park Inn. (November 22nd). You may be asking "What is a Soap Sack?"

Here is a blurb from their website: "Stacy Wiener, Founder of <u>S.A.CK</u>. (<u>Supporting A Community</u> with Kindness), discovered through volunteering at food pantries, that there was a lack of essential toiletries available. One key reason is that people are not able to use government subsidies, such as food stamps, to purchase them. When it comes to deciding on whether to eat vs. buy soap and shampoo, the choice becomes obvious. So, in September of 2017, S.A.C.K. was started as a grassroots effort to help address this need while connecting people from all over the world, interested in crocheting/knitting soap sacks and then donating them (with a bar of soap in each one) to homeless shelters, food pantries, relief efforts, veteran clinics and social service

Since starting S.A.C.K., we estimate that over 100,000 soap sacks have been distributed by volunteers in every state in the U.S., as well as Asia, Australia, Europe and Canada. The response has also been overwhelmingly positive, with over 8,500 Facebook followers. There is a definite need for toiletries throughout the underserved population.

While we accept donations of bar soap and crocheted or knitted sacks, we encourage you to donate soap sacks (with a full size bar of soap in its original packaging in each one) in your local area."

There are both Crochet and Knit patterns on the Website, and also templates for tags to add to the Soap Sacks. They need to be made with 100% cotton yarn. So far I have 30 Soap Sacks and the soap to fill them.


