This too shall pass. This season of sickness and uncertainty will pass. There will come a season of health and joy. On that day we will rejoice in the power of our Risen Savior.

- With public schools closed until May 20, I have no idea when to start in person worship. That decision will be made at a later day. BUT when we do meet again, we will be celebrating Easter and having a Pot Luck. An EPIC pot luck.

Deacon's Report: Jerry Gray

- We have been doing the on-line sermons every Sunday on our Facebook page, and even an extra Sunrise Service on Easter. - Barb T. sent out a letter to all rental/self-help groups about not meeting. It was also necessary to cancel one-shot rentals. May will remain a question.

Controller's Report: Susan Wiley

- Without weekly services, pledges are down.
- Paid quarterly expenses in March so YTD deficit is currently -\$22,271

Daysha Haxton: Thank you everyone on Council for continuing to run the church. Pastor Dave has done an excellent job of calling members to stay in touch with them at home. Thank you for posting the live Sunday worship service on Facebook. We share the ECC video for everything posted. Suggest that instead of Elmwood clean-up day we all just clean up the trash from around our own neighborhoods. We can take pictures and post them on the ECC Facebook page.

The church vegetable and flower garden beds need tending. After May 1st we can start preparing the soil for planting? My brother Brian would like to donate a few tomato plants that he is growing from seeds now. I have basil seeds and green onion seeds. Should we plant seeds this year? I am not sure if garden centers will be open this year or if they are taking orders for pick up. I have a feeling that with the outbreak people will have to stay home and not work longer than expected. It has been hard to find fresh vegetables and fruit in the stores. The church garden could be a very important resource for us this year. I suggest we make a list of gardening chores to be done and a timetable. Then we can have an online sign-up sheet for volunteers. We can stagger times so people can work alone or in pairs. Which vegetables do we want to plant?


