

Council Moderator's Report

Monday, December 21, 2020

In attendance: Cindy Gauthier, Colleen Peterson, Jerry Gray – in person, Bill Alberti, Susan Wiley, Wendy Leonard, Gail O'Connor – by Zoom

Meeting called to order at 6:37 pm

Minutes for November were reviewed and accepted.

Deacon's Report - Jerry Gray

- Continued prayers for Craig Croxall and Charles Shorter.
- Pat MacDougall passed away Saturday, December 19, 2020. A memorial will be held later next year.
- Indoor & online services this past Sunday the live broadcast wouldn't start. Jerry had to record it and posted later in the day. There are some concerns regarding volume and that is being worked on. Also, getting comments that people can't hear Wendy Leonard on-line. Jerry is trying to get a longer neck for the microphone to help this issue.
- Jerry called California again regarding the website and hasn't heard back from them in two weeks. He will reach out to them again. It is almost built. Thankfully we haven't had to pay for any of this yet.
- Christmas Sunday service was lovely. We had 20 poinsettias, 17 wreaths and 23 people attended. Rowan O'Connor brought the baby Jesus up to the creche. Madelyn O'Connor did a very nice job lighting the last Advent candle and reading about the Shepherd's candle.

Christian Ed – Gail O'Connor

- Christmas cards were made after the November 29th service by several church members. Barbara T. mailed them out last Friday.
- Gail gave Barbara T. some website links for fun Advent activities to put in Elmwords.

Missions - Cindy Gauthier

- South Park Inn is having a website/computer issue and the calendar for 2021 is still not available. Charlie advised to try back after the holidays.
- Cindy & Haley Gauthier, her friends Victoria & Matt Bragg and their daughter Peyton made and delivered the dinner to South Park on November 22nd. The Bragg's donated

all of the food so no money was needed from the Mission's budget. Matt roasted turkeys and we all peeled a lot of potatoes and made a Thanksgiving Shepard's Pie. The soap sacks that Gail & Wendy made were also dropped off and the residents were very happy to receive them. This can be a continuing donation.

 Susan still has not heard back from WH Social Services regarding the collection of mittens, etc. or doing the Adopt-A-Family this year. She will keep trying.

Trustees - Bill Alberti

- Currently five groups renting the church.
- Mark Janas put together a 2021 budget that includes rental of parsonage which has
 not yet been rented. Expenses are down \$44,000 from last year not having a full-time
 pastor and related benefit expenses. That number takes into account what we are
 currently paying Rev. Janet Stoddard for Sundays and parish care. Income is also down
 both in rentals due to Covid-19 and in pledging.
- Anticipate taking \$32,000 out of the Barnum Fund next year as opposed to \$80,000 last year.
- Susan Wiley is working incredibly hard on renting the parsonage. To date: 61 internet inquiries, 19 agent showings as of 12/15 and 3 applications one of which has 2 children and another from a pastor with 4 children whose agent keeps trying to get the rent under \$2,000. Trustees are being super careful about picking a good tenant as once someone moves in, it is very difficult to remove them should they not be able to make rent. Again, thank you to Susan for her continued hard work.
- The dead tree was removed from the parsonage property.
- Locks for the parsonage garage and porch were repaired.
- New Sexton, Judy Williams is terrific!
- We received but did not sign a contract from Precise Landscaping as despite being very good, they are very expensive. Asked the people CVS uses but they only do commercial properties. We will continue to pay Precise Landscaping until we can find someone less expensive.
- We also now have heat in the church. Hartford Boiler spent the good part of several days repairing the furnace and replacing parts. Don't yet know what we will be charged but we are grateful to have them. Many thanks to the Marshall family!

Controller's Report – Susan Wiley

- Financial Summary 2020 through November passed out. So far \$33,139 in pledge income. \$45,000 taken from principal of Barnum Fund.
- YTD income \$111,578 vs expenses \$130,501 leaving a \$18,923 deficit until we can rent the parsonage.
- October expenses down to \$7,563 without salary, benefits and other expenses of a full-time pastor from \$12,835 in September.

Member at Large - Wendy Leonard - No report. Daysha Haxton-Not present, no report.

Old Business -

- Stewardship as of 12/20/20 We received \$35,529 in pledge income 2020. For 2021 \$33,966 pledged so far with only 6 pledges outstanding. As of 11/30/20, the Barnum Fund was at \$176,608. Went up \$10,000 over the month of October.
- Thank you to those who have pledged. Pledge cards are available if needed.
- Cindy got a call on her way home from last month's Council meeting from David Clymer
 @ Grace Church. He advised that the Elders have decided to stay where they were currently meeting at Truth Baptist in South Windsor. He will let us know if anything changes.
- Annual meeting postponed until the 2nd quarter of 2021. Update will be provided in March.

New Business -

- Good news!! Council has hired Rev. Janet Stoddard as a part-time designated interim through Easter Sunday, April 4, 2021. Details are being worked out but we are excited to have her continue with us for a few more months and provide us with some continuity.
- On Sunday, December 20th @ 11:00 am Rev. Janet Stoddard, Cindy Gauthier, Jerry Gray, Susan Wiley and Colleen Peterson met over Zoom with Regional Minister Rev. Tamara Mooreland to discuss direction and next steps for ECC to take. She recommended we hire Janet whose main focus would be to facilitate whichever of the following three processes Council presents to the congregation to vote on.
 - 1. Transplant we move ourselves as a congregation/church family into another church.
 - 2. Closure.
 - 3. Merger we and another church combine, share a pastor and a building but keep our congregations distinct.
- We need to do financial projections for this year and next. We need to determine our "why" and in discussion with Tamara it was clear that we have a lot of long-time members who we really care about that have grown up with the church and don't want to see it close. We also have a lot of need in our neighborhood and newcomers to our church are often looking for help. Our "why" sounds like "caring for our community" both within and without the church.
- As a first step, we could share ministries with another, similar congregational church such as the Newington Church. Tamara thinks they and we are a good fit theologically and otherwise. We keep our own identity as ECC but pay to share Bible Study, Confirmation Classes, youth programs with them. This fills a need on our part and also allows us to get to know each other as congregations. That way, should we decide to transplant the congregation, there is already a shared history.

- There is the possibility of applying for a UCC Crossroads "Faith for the Future" grant of up to \$5,000 (to be paid back) with a deadline of January 15, 2021. We will be discussing this further with Pastor Janet.
- Next Zoom meeting with Rev. Tamara Mooreland is Sunday, 1/10/21 @ 11:00 am.

REV. JANET STODDARD

Good news!! Council has hired Rev. Janet Stoddard as a part-time designated interim pastor through Easter Sunday, 4/4/2021. Details are being worked out, but we are excited to have her continue with us for a few more months and provide us with some continuity.

Rev. Janet Stoddard started her life down the street in Newington and grew up on a small farm off of Fenn Road with her sister and two brothers. She showed steers in 4-H and went to Newington Schools. Church of Christ Congregational was foundational in forming her faith as were her parents and attending Silver Lake Conference Center. She attended Dickinson College in Carlisle, Pennsylvania and graduated with a BA in History. Working at the Episcopal Camp and Conference Center in Ivoryton during the summers (now Incarnation Camp) after graduation and camp, she traveled to England and worked as a nanny in Stoke Ferry for six months and then backpacked with a friend from camp for 6 weeks around Europe. Janet attended Andover Newton Theological School in Newton Center, MA and quit to work for two chiropractors and then a dentist finally returning to Andover Newton to finish her Master of Divinity degree after a number of years working. Soon after graduation Janet began working as the Protestant

campus minister at CCSU in New Britain and Ordained October 1999. While working at CCSU, she began doing per diem chaplaincy at the Hospital for Special Care (HFSC) which is a long term acute care facility in New Britain. That moved into part time work, and she has now served theref or 21 years.
