
Elmwords



Council Moderator's Report July 13, 2020

In attendance: Cindy Gauthier, Susan Wiley, Colleen Peterson, Jerry Gray, Gail O'Connor, Bill Alberti, Pastor Dave Congdon

Pastor Dave opened the meeting at 6:36 p.m. with a scripture reading from Romans 8:28 and a prayer. "We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." God works in everything. Things can seem good, bad, or otherwise but God is always there. He works to bring good in and through everything. Think of Good Friday where Jesus was crucified – horrible. Then think of Easter three days later where Christ is risen – miraculous and wonderful! With God, things always work out. Amen.

Due to the global pandemic of a corona virus called Covid-19, this is our first in-person Council meeting since February as the state and most of the nation was shut down to try and contain the virus. Council held a virtual meeting April 20th and a combination of Minutes/Moderator's notes was published in Elmwords to inform the congregation on what the church was doing. We are also enduring an extended heatwave.

February and April minutes were reviewed and accepted.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Dave

- Ginger Croxall has fully moved into the Grove St. house and is helping her brother Craig.

- Gene Knorr is now in the memory care unit at Avery.

- Al Rakus, our sexton, died. His brother Rich would like any items he had at the church and Pastor Dave will see to that. Susan W. sent Rich a personal card. Will ask Cynthia Pavey to send him a card from the church.
- Our first outdoor service on 7/12 worked well.

Deacon's Report: Jerry Gray

- Jerry and Pastor Dave ran a trial run outdoor service on Thursday 7/9. Unfortunately, the camera was in a metal case and being out in the sun for two hours, it got fried. Jerry ordered a new camera. Used his phone on 7/12 to record the service but the video cut out after 20 minutes due to the heat. Next Sunday he'll have his deck umbrella to shade himself and the equipment. Will also move the electronic piano over by the hedgerow in the shade as poor Jerry Bilak fried on 7/12.
- Jerry B. will be on vacation for three weeks. Colleen Peterson will play piano next Sunday 7/19 and James O'Connor will play guitar the following two Sundays to cover.
- Pastor Dave's daily messages are continuing on-line, and if the weather is bad on a Sunday, will record Pastor Dave inside the Fellowship Room as before.
- Our new website is still under its test name. With the virus, everything is super backlogged. Jerry did a test broadcast on Facebook.

Christian Ed Report: Gail O'Connor

- Pancake supper went well.
- Thankfully had not ordered supplies for Easter. Phew.
- Found better bibles on-line and ordered one. Can do a google meet for Haley and Gabby. (Susan made motion. Jerry seconded. Report accepted.)

Missions Report: Cindy Gauthier

- Next South Park dinner is 7/19. Cindy & Carol Alberti will be making pasta salad and hot dogs at church to drop off along with sandwiches and cookies.
- Daysha, James and Frank have volunteered to help.
- Remaining South Park dinners will be 9/20 & 11/22.

(Gail made motion. Bill seconded. Report accepted.)

Trustees Report:Bill Alberti

- Short and Long-term rentals status: Fresh Start has begun meeting in Conte Hall.
- No repairs have been done.
- Kyle Cunningham is mowing the lawns.
- Need to hire a new sexton. Pastor Dave will empty waste baskets in the interim.

(Jerry made motion. Gail seconded. Report accepted.)

Controller's Report: Susan Wiley

- Despite no church services, received \$4,000 in pledges in April. Less in May (\$2,600) and June (\$2,000).
- \$20,000 was taken from the Barnum Fund in April
- \$17,750 was received from the federal government under their Paycheck Protection Program. Thank you to Mark Janas for that!
- Ended May with \$3,400 surplus. Ended June with a \$5,000 deficit.

(Jerry made motion. Bill seconded. Report accepted.)

Member at Large Report:

Wendy Leonard - Not present, no report. DayshaHaxton - Not present, no report.

Discussion:

Pastor Dave accepted a call to a church in Massachusetts. He is starting the new position October 1st. His last Sunday with us will be August 30th. We are sad that he is leaving us and sadder still that despite all our best efforts over the last 10 years, we have not been able to increase membership or income to be able to continue to sustain a full-time pastor.

We are, however, very happy that Pastor Dave found full-time employment, despite his wishing he could have stayed with us until he retired.

What to do next:

- Susan asked Trustees to take a look at the general finances and see if our income can meet expenses without a full-time pastor. Parsonage would sell for about \$150,000.
- Bill asked if we can rent the parsonage to a business like a dentist or accountant? Susan explained that would require a zoning change which WH is very reluctant to do.

- Jerry will get in touch with Tamara Mooreland regarding next steps. Each interim has their own specialty, e.g. membership, finances, and can help us move forward.
- Trustees need to figure out a budget and determine how much of the income pie can be used toward an interim so we can determine whether we can afford a full-time interim or part-time interim, or just supply pulpits.

Council Moderator's Report August 11, 2020

Since our July meeting, Hurricane Isaias went up the East coast further inland than initially expected. New England got little rain but lots of wind damage and power outages. West Hartford was without power for nearly a week for some and longer for others. All this during the continuing oppressive heatwave. 2020 has been quite the year so far and it's not over yet.

Pastor Dave opened the meeting at 6:40 p.m. with a scripture reading from Genesis 12:1-3and a prayer. He chose this passage in thinking about his own new journey come October. "Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

This is the first example of having faith in God. Abram started out not knowing how it would end. Yet he gave us the Old Testament which gave us the New Testament and Jesus. This passage tells us to go from your settled life, from where you are, to a future you don't know. It says to BEGIN, then follow and what happens, happens. A full faith, a mature faith lets us trust God so we can begin and then again trust that God will guide us into a future filled with grace and joy. Amen.

Deacon's Report: Jerry Gray

- Outdoor services have been going well with the last few going very well. They are being well received both by those who attend and those who watch online.
- Thank you to Colleen who played piano for a service and to Jamie O'Connor who played his guitar for one service to cover Jerry Bilak's vacation. Both did a great job!
- The weather has held up so far for outdoor services.
- No response from contact in California for the new website. CA is being slammed with Covid-19 and wildfires so don't know when we'll hear from them.
- Garden has been growing: cherry tomatoes, yellow squash and zucchini, six basil plants so help yourself to basil, cucumbers and all. There are few beans. Suspect rabbits.
- Edie & Jerry collected about 100 gallons of black walnuts from the Memorial Garden making multiple trips to Brixton (the dump). Major thanks to both of them!!
- Pastor Dave picked up lots of branches around the church property after Hurricane Isaias. Rick Coler and Jerry Gray got them to the curb for the town to pick up.

Trustees Report:Bill Alberti

- Hiring Frank Nobou to be the church sexton. Need to revise old job description.
- After info from Susan W. on selling vs. renting the parsonage, Trustees decided the better option was to rent. While Pastor Dave is still living there, work can be done on the outside without disturbing him. Need to power-wash the house and kill/pull all the weeds. Once Dave has moved out, the inside needs a deep cleaning, wallpaper needs to be taken off the dining room walls and the interior needs a fresh coat of paint. Susan will pass along the name of her handyman for some of the projects. Need to set a budget and prioritize the projects to be done within set budget.

(Jerry made motion. Susan seconded. Report accepted.)

Controller's Report: Susan Wiley

- Lost power & internet for a week. No reports. (Colleen made motion. Jerry seconded. Report accepted.)

Member at Large Report:

Wendy Leonard – Not present, no report. Daysha Haxton – Not present, no report.

Discussion:

Jerry Gray did get in touch with our Regional Minister, Tamara Mooreland. She suggested we get an Extended Supply Minister (ESM) for 60 days. They cost \$200-\$250/week. They do Sunday services and some pastoral stuff during the week, perhaps coming into the office one day a week. An ESM will help guide us to the next step. This is an "in the meantime thing" that will give us a couple months breathing room to figure out what we do next, e.g. do we want to get an interim or go to a part-time pastor.

She has two people in mind for us, one of which just finished interim minister training, that she will contact and she promised we would have an ESM by September 1st. She also recommended that we take Labor Day Sunday 9/6 off and start on Sunday 9/13.

She left for a 2-week vacation yesterday and will be back on 8/24. She wants to meet with Deacons, Moderator and Pastoral Relations Committee when she returns. She will meet with the congregation at the end of September.

She recommended we read Sections One and Two of a UCC document on Transitions and New Beginnings. Jerry has only been able to find Section Two. He will keep looking.

There will be an exit interview with Pastor Dave using a prepared list of questions.

Pastor Dave has "the book" with the Service of Release. He has already made copies of it. Conference minister(s) will be in on this Service 8/30.

Tamara said we were in a good place despite our financial situation. This is because we already have an on-line presence, and we are calling everyone in the congregation and communicating with people. A lot of people are watching the on-line services. A lot of churches who are also in a tough spot financially are not even on-line, and not necessarily well-known in their communities.

We are known in the community as we do South Park Inn dinners, participate in town parades, neighborhood clean-up days, Habitat for Elmwood, community food events (Strawberry Festival and Chicken BBQ), Little Free Library on the property, donations to the WH Food Pantry, and so on. Many thanks to Missions and to Susan Wiley for making our presence in the community known, as well as all congregation members who work hard at various events. Colleen noted that we are like the scene in Dr. Seuss' "Horton Hears a Who": "We are here. We are here."

At this point Council asked Pastor Dave to leave the meeting.

The other thing Tamara said we need to do is to celebrate Pastor Dave. We agreed on doing an outside Coffee Hour. A letter has already been sent out to the congregation to take up a collection as a farewell gift. People were asked to send in notes and memories to put into a scrapbook, which Kirsten Peterson is coordinating.
