### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

I heard on the news that it has been over a year since the first report of the Coronavirus in the United States. Personally, I didn't notice until late February mainly because I had plans to travel with my sister in mid-March. It is hard to fathom that we have all been dealing with COVID 19 for a year. Besides some savvy epidemiologists and others in the know, many of us didn't imagine living like we have in the past year. I never thought I would spend most of my time at work wearing a mask. Did you ever think it would be ok to grab a cup of tea or coffee and sit in your favorite chair at home to watch church on Facebook or YouTube?

This week after church I walked the dog in the park near my home, and a woman who lives nearby flagged me down to ask what had happened on the street adjacent to mine. On Saturday night, she had seen the ambulances and heard the sirens on her street and was concerned, because she didn't know what had happened. I let her know that there had been a fire, but as far as I knew, everyone got out safely and that the house was badly damaged. She was relieved to hear that the people had gotten out safely, but then she said, "do you think this is the end of the world? You think nothing else can happen that is bad, but then bad things keep happening. I think the world is ending." People have been struggling with when the world will end for as long as human beings have thought about such things I imagine but in the last year this has been something I have heard more and more about from people who are wondering aloud. To be honest, I don't think the end of the world is coming and even if it is, I don't know what I can do about it. It is a debate that I don't think needs our time or our attention right now because if you believe in God, whether we live or whether we die, we are with God. The fire on our street was just one more thing that has happened recently in a world where too many terrible things have and are happening.

So how do we as people of faith continue to cope with all that we see and hear on a daily basis? One suggestion is to keep praying and to pray fervently. Philippians 4:5-7 reminds us to, "Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." It is of course easier said than done but worth an attempt still. Another possible source of solace is to read scripture, especially the Psalms. In Psalm 62:8 we are reminded to, "Trust in God at all times, O people; pour out your heart before God; God is a refuge for us."

It is also important to stay connected. It can be difficult, but pick up the phone and call a friend or someone from your church family. If someone calls and leaves you a message, call her or him back. It matters, you matter, your church matters and your faith matters. It is for such a time as this that our community of faith can make all the difference. Stay safe, stay healthy, pray unceasingly and trust in God at all times. Remember that you are surrounded by God's light and love, you are safe and protected.

### Deacon's Report - Jerry Gray

- Continued prayers for Craig Croxall and Charles Shorter.
- Pat MacDougall's service will possibly be on May 21<sup>st</sup> if allowed to congregate by then.
   Will be in Conte Hall as there will be a reception.
- New website is up and running and looks great. Checked with web service to see about being hacked with Janet's picture off the website sent out to people asking for money. They could only tell us that it was not done by a robot but by someone personally. Statistics will be available at some point. Because of the year's delay, we are still in a grace period. Eventually we will have to pay for the site. They only take credit or debit for monthly payments of \$29. However, we can get a 10% discount and pay for the year in full up front by check so will do that when the time comes.
- Because the food wagon was very full and we wanted to get the food to WH Food Pantry to give out sooner than later, we blessed the food wagon this week.
- Communion will be on January 31<sup>st</sup> as Pastor Janet will be off the week of 2/1-2/7.
- Reverend Tom Anderson, Coordinator of Spiritual Services at the Hospital for Special Care in New Britain will be preaching on Sunday 2/7.
- There will be no service or ashes on Ash Wednesday, 2/17.

- No Pancake Supper this year.
- Will make and send Valentine's cards to our home-bound members.
- Gail asked if we could do a Google Meet of Zoom Bible Study or book club.

### **Missions -Cindy Gauthier**

- Dates for dropping off dinner to South Park Inn for 2021 are: 2/21, 4/18, 6/20, 8/22, 10/24 and 12/19.
- No budget monies were allocated to OCWM for 2020.
- Due to crossed communications, we had 24-hour notice to pull off Adopt-a-Family at Christmas and we did it! Single mom with a 17 year-old boy, 11 year-old boy and 7 year-old twins (boy & girl). It was awesome! Those of us who contributed said that it totally made it feel like Christmas. Thank you to everyone.
- Chuck Peterson dropped off the scarves, hats and mittens to WH Social Services.

### Trustees - Bill Alberti

- Currently \$179,000 in the Barnum Fund.
- Mark Janas applied for \$17,000 PPP (State of CT Paycheck Protection Program) loan that we are hoping will be forgiven.
- Gene Knorr's estate made a generous donation both to Scholarships and to the General Fund. Council thanks the family for that!
- Received \$4,031 from CVS for snowplowing this winter.
- So far this winter, snowplowing/salting from Precision Landscaping has cost us \$2,000. We are still looking for an alternative.
- Getting five \$100 Visa gift cards through Scrips program to give to John Marshall and his staff at Hartford Boiler to thank them for all the time they have donated working on the church furnace lately. Pastor Janet will write thank you notes to go with the gift cards.
- People are still finding the church warm at times when not in use. Discussed possibility
  of installing thermostats that can be remotely controlled by someone's phone.
- Trustees approved Pastor Janet Stoddard's contract at last meeting. She will be doing Sunday sermon, 2 hours in the office on Tuesdays 3-5 pm and parish care-phone calls and emergencies.
- Lots of activity and inquiries on renting the parsonage but no success yet. Thank you to Susan Wiley for all the time she has been putting into this.
- Trustees would like to find out what is involved in selling the parsonage separating the
  property from the church deed, etc. since it is a hot market still. If separable and we sell
  it, we could double the amount in the Barnum Fund and start generating interest
  income.

- Church received a letter from the Town of West Hartford stating that since the parsonage is no longer used to house a pastor, we would owe taxes on it. Mark Janas estimates this will be about \$5,800 a year.
- Judy Williams, our new sexton, will be asked to drain the pipe on the furnace once every month or two. Hartford Boiler will show her how to do it.

### Controller's Report - Susan Wiley

- No financial report for December.
- Rental income for 2020 was \$9,200, down almost 2/3 from last year due to Covid.

Member at Large - Wendy Leonard - No report. Daysha Haxton-Not present, no report.

### Old Business -

- After reading what was involved with applying for a UCC Crossroads "Faith for the Future" grant of up to \$5,000 (to be paid back) with a deadline of 1/15/21, and discussing it with Pastor Janet, Council decided not to apply.
- Zoom meeting with Rev. Tamara Mooreland on Sunday January 10, 2021 at 121:00 am was cancelled as we had nothing new to discuss with her.

### New Business -

- Pastor Janet offered to do a Bible study over Google Meet twice a month on Tuesdays at 7:00 p.m. starting February 9<sup>th</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup>. An announcement
- Asked Board chairs and Council members to write up their annual reports for 2020 as soon as possible so that an Annual Report for 2020 could be put out to the congregation. Since not much happened last year due to the pandemic, reports will be brief. Colleen will put a notice in Elmwords about the 2020 Annual Report.
