PASTOR'S CORNER

"Accordingly I command all that it is unlawful to eat or drink in their company, neither should anyone accept alms from such men; not until they do penances so harsh that their tears pour out to God." St Patrick excommunicating the men who murdered and enslaved Irish Christians.

"I bind unto myself today the strong name of the Trinity,
By invocation of the same the Three in One and One in Three.
I bind this to me forever by power of faith, Christ's incarnation,
His baptism in the Jordan River, His death on Cross for my salvation."
From the hymn "St. Patrick's Breastplate" Attributed to St. Patrick 387 - 461

No, St Patrick did not drive all the snakes out of Ireland; there never were any. Yes, St Patrick did use the shamrock to illustrate the holy Trinity. He was raised in a Christian home, although he appears not to have paid much attention to the faith. At 16 years old, he was snatched from Britain and held in slavery in Ireland for six years. Cold, wet, hungry, and under constant fear of violent abuse, he prayed "as many as a hundred prayers a day, and in the night almost as many."

One night in a vision, God told him that a ship was ready to take him to freedom. He made the 200 mile journey by cover of darkness. By his clothes anyone could see at a glance that he was a slave; and slaves could be returned for a generous reward. After a dangerous journey, he reached the harbor, and by the grace of God persuaded the captain to grant him free passage home.

After some time Patrick had another vision. This time he perceived the Irish people begging him to come and teach them about Jesus. His seminary training was difficult because he hadn't paid much attention to the faith before being carried off to Ireland, and he had missed crucial years of schooling. At last Patrick returned to Ireland; his success at conveying the Gospel was astonishing. Entire kingdoms converted; he ordained many, many priests; daughters of kings devoted themselves to serving Christ. St. Patrick was unique among Christian leaders for condemning slavery. It wasn't until the 1700s that people, even Christians, began to question whether slavery was compatible with Christianity.

Well and good. There is more to St Patrick than celebrations of St Patrick's Day that involve wearing funny green hats, drinking green beer, and speaking in phony baloney Irish accents. In St Patrick's honor, we might well ask where are those who suffer from slavery. Real slavery and sex trafficking. People are enslaved by addictions of all kinds. How might we raise our voices on their behalf?

In St. Patrick 's Day, an entire island had not heard the Gospel; they knew little or nothing of God's love. In our day, there are many people who have heard very little of Jesus, or only heard a pale and feeble version. Their lives would be immeasurably blessed by coming to know Christ; the world would benefit by more folks who believe. How might we raise our voices on their behalf?


